

The Conservancy Park

Located in Belleview Bottoms along KY Route 18, The Conservancy Park consists of forty-five acres of prairie, woodland, and hillside owned by TBC. The land, formerly a retired gravel



mine and general eye-sore in the community, was purchased by TBC in 2005. In collaboration with the Boone County Parks and Recreation Department and Boone County Conservation District, reclamation of the site was completed by 2009. The park, designed by GBN Architects of Cincinnati and officially dedicated in 2012, is home to numerous native



plant species including native grasses in the prairie and native flowers in the rain garden. Park amenities include a fishing lake stocked by the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Andrew

Schrage Fishing Dock, unpaved walking trails, and the Noel Shelter House designed by the American Institute of Architects. The scenic park is a tribute to Boone County's natural beauty and is a great place to picnic, fish, take a casual stroll, or attend scheduled classes and events!
